While the Community Carnival officially kicks off on Monday, such is the excitement among NRL clubs that they are starting early! NSW Origin star Jamie Lyon will join Sea Eagles team-mates in Coonamble, in the far west of NSW, on Saturday to conduct coaching clinics and help local high school students finish construction of awnings to cover community barbecue areas at the local weir, which was damaged during recent flooding. Nathan Hindmarsh, FuiFui MoiMoi, Brett Kimmorley, Ben Hannant, Jason Cayless, Chris Lawrence, Luke Lewis and Petero Civoniceva will be among the local heroes who will join 2000 students at the various coaching clinics. Throughout the week across Sydney and the Central Coast, Rabbitohs, Roosters, Sea Eagles and Sharks stars will conduct coaching clinics and school visits before players venture to areas such as Nyngan, Bourke, Walgett, Coffs Harbour, Atherton – and to Rotorua, in New Zealand. Test stars Joel Monaghan and Bronson Harrison will lead the entire Canberra Raiders squad into the Riverina, visiting more than 11,000 students and 55 schools in Gundagai, Wagga Wagga, Narooma, Tumut and Cootamundra. Bulldogs captain Andrew Ryan will join team-mates Danny Williams, Corey Payne and Gary Warburton in his home town of Dubbo, visiting more than 4500 school students as well as attending junior league sign-on sessions. Broncos and Titans players will travel across regional Queensland and the Northern Rivers, Knights players will venture throughout the Hunter region and to Tamworth, Storm stars will visit Corowa, Wodonga and Wangaratta, while Dragons stars will hold coaching clinics in Perth in the lead-up to their much-anticipated trial match against the Eels.
